## The Sunshine Coast Food Bank

- Opened in Gibsons in 1983.
- Now situated in Sechelt at 5657 Lamprey Lane.
- Our mandate is to gather, store and distribute food to those in need in our community.
- Member of Canadian Association of Food Banks.
- Team of 25 volunteers contributed 3,235 hours in 2011.



## The Sunshine Coast Food Bank

- Support clients from Langdale to Egmont.
- Open every Tuesday and Wednesday from 11am to 1pm.
- Distribute bread and produce weekly and groceries every second week.
- Have an onsite walk-in freezer and cooler for storage.
- Children accounted for approximately one third of that number.



## Our Challenges

- Balancing nutrition vs. quantity vs. costs.
- Lack of food skills or cooking facilities for clients.
- Meeting the needs throughout the year.
- Maintaining a steady volunteer program.
- Educating the community about poverty.



## 2012 Stats

- Food Bank Distribution 2012
  - 3,163 households representing 6,855 individuals of whom 2,575 are children
  - Monthly Average: 351 households, 761 individuals, 286 children
- Bread and Produce Days 2012
  - 1,502 households representing 3,088 individuals of whom 1,102 are children
  - Monthly Average: 166 households, 343 individuals, 122 children

## 2012 Highlights

- March 5 & 6 was biggest Food Bank of the year
  - 201 households received food
  - 413 individuals of whom 141 are children
  - Breakdown of Families:
    - One person 115
    - Two person 30
    - Three person 25
    - Four person 4
    - Six person -7
    - Seven person 1
    - Ten person 1

Many of these multi-person groups are single parent families

  - Food and Nutrition Workshop

- SC Botanical Gardens and Chatelech Secondary Foods Program:
  - Students farm, harvest and preserve vegetables
- The Fruit Tree Project:
  - Volunteers harvest fruit from privately owned trees
- Protein Program:
  - Protein for People Program
